## **18 HOLE - PAR 3 GOLF COURSE**

### **Ladies Day 2011** **Information Package**

For 2011 our Ladies Day will be on **Wednesday** and **Thursday** . The golf fee will be \$20.00 and registration will be on a first come, first serve basis.

At time of registration, the Ladies Day registration form must be filled out and a \$20.00 registration fee paid before participating in Ladies Day.

Registration starts April 20<sup>th</sup> at the Clubhouse. The first Ladies Day will be on May 4<sup>th</sup> and 5<sup>th</sup> (weather permitting). Ladies can book their Tee Times one week in advance (April 27<sup>th</sup> for the first Ladies Day)

#### **No Shows**

A “**No Show**” is a golfer who books a tee time and does not show up, or is late for their tee time. If a golfer does not plan to show up for a booked tee time we require a phone call to indicate this. If a golfer is going to be late for their tee time we require a phone call to attempt to accommodate this problem. In any case there is **no guarantee** we will be able to adjust tee times for you, however we will do our best. Each week “No Shows” will be tracked and listed. The tracking of the “No Show” golfer is adopted to encourage consideration for the golfers who faithfully play on Ladies Day.

#### **Tee Box Position**

Alder Hills has the unique ability of offering grass, and fixed mat, tee off positions. On Ladies Day golfers have the option of choosing to tee off from the fixed mats or using the grass area as marked by the white tee box blocks. Both tee off location are acceptable on Ladies Day, your choice.

## **Tee Time Booking**

The first Ladies Day will be Wednesday May 4<sup>th</sup> and Thursday May 5<sup>th</sup>. Registered golfers can book their tee times starting April 28<sup>th</sup>. We will continue to book one week in advance, so each week you can book for the following week.

- Ladies Day is a **9 Hole Event**. The cost is \$20.00 for the nine holes, of which \$12.00 is for green fees and \$8.00 is held for weekly prizes.
- **Before 1:00pm**, Ladies can play 18 holes for \$26.00, but must start on the front or back nine as required that week.
- **After 2:00pm**, the course is for Ladies Day only.
- Golfers must play with other Ladies Day members **ONLY**.
- Ladies wanting to play 18 holes will only be able if space and time is available, as Ladies will be teeing off both front and back nine.
- Normal procedures will apply as to filling out a foursome with other golfers as needed to best use available tee times.

## **Scoring**

Ladies must record your total strokes for the hole, **and** the number of putts you took in a separate line. If the golfer uses a putter from off the green it does **not** count as a putt.

It is **imperative** to give your scorecard to another golfer in your group to record your score and sign the scorecard after the round. **Only** another Ladies Day golfer in your group can sign your scorecard.

The score sheets will be posted inside the clubhouse. Check your handicap weekly, don't assume it did not change. Place your score card in the correct box. **Please check and add everything correctly.**

## **Ladies Day Final Tournament**

The Ladies finale will start on Friday September 16<sup>th</sup>, and finish on Saturday September 17<sup>th</sup> with awards and dinner.

## **Prizes (all Weekly Prizes will be cash prizes)**

Once a Ladies Day golfer has played three games their handicap will be established. **Handicaps from other golf courses cannot be used.** Handicaps from members of Ladies Day last year will start with the handicap they finished with at the end of last season.

Prize money breakdown distribution is listed below.

- \$3.00 **Weekly Prizes** (low gross and net, KP's, LP's)
  - \$1.00 Birdies
  - \$1.00 weekly draw
  - \$1.00 Hole in one pot
  - \$1.00 Year end draw (trip voucher(s))
  - \$1.00 Final Tournament prizes

- \$8.00 weekly prize total

### Weekly Prizes

#### KP's – Closest to the Pin

Three KP's are marked out of 9 holes each week.

You must be on the green with your first shot to qualify for a KP.

#### LP's – Longest Putt

Three LP's are marked out of 9 holes each week.

Any putt sunk which is longer than any other Ladies Day golfer that day, qualifies for the longest putt. You must be on the green for the shot to be considered as a putt.

Putting from off the green is not a putt.

#### Low Putts

One prize is awarded for each handicap flight.

During your nine holes keep track of how many putts you take on each hole. Putts taken from off the green are not recorded as putts.

#### Low Gross – Low Net

Prizes are awarded for the lowest gross and net scores per handicap flight.

Note: If you win low gross, you are not eligible for low net. If there is a tie, a count back would be done. (The highest score on the final hole wins, etc.)

#### Birdies

A Birdie on our course is a ball that is in the cup on the second stroke. A Birdie Sheet will be posted each week. It will be **your responsibility** to enter your name under the appropriate hole on the sheet. The weekly birdie pot will be shared by dividing the pot by the number of birdies.

### Weekly Draws

Each week names will be drawn from the scorecards and the amount for that week (\$1.00 per golfer) will be divided.

### Hole in One Pot

The Hole In One Pot will be pro-rated. For example, if you get a Hole in One and you have played 5 of the 10 Ladies Days, you will receive 5/10ths of the pot, but if you played all 10 of the Ladies Day's, you qualify for the entire pot. **Note:** You must card the Hole in One on the nine holes that you are scoring for Ladies Day. You must also have the Hole in One witnessed by another Ladies Day participant in your group. If the Hole in One is on a hole with a KP, you do not receive the KP prize.

Any money remaining in the pot at year-end will be used for prizes on the Ladies Day Final.

### **Please show up for your Tee Time at least 15 minutes early.**

If golfers arrive late we cannot guarantee that we can get them out to play. We will not jeopardize the pace of play to try and fit in late golfers.

### **Pace of Play**

Slow play and delayed tee time are a source of tension and confrontation that can be easily avoided with proper consideration by all golfers. Keep up the pace of play (about seven minutes per hole) or let faster golfers play through. **The procedure for a "play through" on our course is for the slower group to tee off first, and then let the faster group tee off before proceeding past the tee box area.** Then the faster group and the slower group both leave the tee box area at the same time, but the faster group plays the hole out first. In this way the slower group does not fall behind as the next group approaches. Cooperation by both groups benefits both groups and it is a good day for golf.

**Note:** Prize money **cannot** be picked up any other day than Ladies Day. An uncollected prize list will be posted each week. All outstanding prizes must be picked up by the last Ladies Day or the money will be added to the Final prize money.

**Ladies Day is based on nine holes of golf.**

**A nine hole round should take less than 1½ hr to complete.**

***If you are holding up the group behind you, you are also holding up everyone else on the entire golf course!!!!***

**Please keep pace, or follow the “play through” procedure as detailed above.**

**We aim to maintain Ladies Day as a fun social event with some competitive value, so please take part and enjoy. We look forward to serving you.**
